Scholarship covers entire camp fee (\$1,690). Teen must arrange own transportation to and from the Portland International Jetport in Portland, Maine where the trip will start and end. If the participant cancels registration, s/he will need to refund the scholarship to Menunkatuck Audubon Society. Menunkatuck will make the scholarship payment directly to Audubon.

If selected, you will be asked to participate in two activities within a year of the camp:

- 1. Share your experiences in some public way when you return. Please include pictures, including one of yourself, so that the audience can have a good sense of your summer camp week.
- 2. Assist with a youth education program or community outreach event.
